Values-driven leadership

Talking to your family and friends about important topics such as decent working rights is the first step in creating awareness.

# **Question Feedback:**

To show good leadership, it is essential to let everyone contribute to the work, by allowing them to use their expertise and strengths. As a leader it is also important to understand what motivates people and what are their values.

# **Question 3**

When you work in a team and you have a discussion with your team members, do you listen to your team members' concerns and do you try to relate to their feelings and mediate?

# **Question Feedback:**

In order to be seen as a leader, it is important to show empathy and to assert your opinions respectfully. Leaving space to actively listen to others contributes to the quality of your work.

# Question 1

#### **Question Feedback:**

A first step in buying sustainable products is being aware of where the products you buy are produced and under which circumstances. In order to buy sustainable, look for fairtrade products for example which are produced under circumstances that respect decent working conditions for the producers.

When you have the choice between two products, one produced faraway and one in your region, do you buy the locally produced product?

Buying locally helps to create jobs for your friends and neighbours, contributes to improved public infrastructure and helps to invest in your community both socially and economically.

# **Question Feedback:**

### **Action Area 3**

Sustainable entrepreneurship

### **Question Feedback:**

Having some knowledge about sustainable business models is essential if you want to support sustainable entrepreneurship. Everyone can show sustainable entrepreneurship, even if you do not own a business yourself. Sustainable entrepreneurship means you see and seize entrepreneurial opportunities that contribute to sustainability. This can be done at school, at home, during an internship or at work. Starting a discussion is the first step to create awareness in your own environment. If you want to know more about sustainable business models, ask your teacher.

# **Question 2**

When you are facing difficulties, are you able to look for alternative solutions?

Not at all. I find this very difficult and confusing.
Rarely, it's difficult to see alternatives.
Often, I analyze the situation and I make a new decision.
Very often, I am able to analyze the situation thoroughly and in a systemic way. I am also able to see multiple future scenarios.

#### **Question Feedback:**

Sustainability issues are very complex. Being able to see alternatives and visions of the future are an essential competence to contribute to solutions to sustainability challenges. This can be done using techniques such as scenario thinking. It is also important not to jump to conclusions too fast and to approach the issues you are facing in a systemic way. If you want to learn more about this, ask your teacher.

#### **Question 3**

How often do you make up excuses for why you didn't do something important?

# **Question Feedback:**

In order to tackle sustainability issues, you should not only be able to analyze the situation and to think of future scenarios. You should also come up with a plan and take action. Strategic thinking and action planning are important competences you can learn.
